

BY-LAWS OF THE DUPAGE TOWNSHIP DEMOCRATIC ORGANIZATION

Article I: Name

The official name of this organization shall be the DUPAGE TOWNSHIP DEMOCRATIC ORGANIZATION.

Article II: Purpose

The purpose of the Dupage Township Democratic Organization shall be to promote the principles and values of the Democratic Party and to help the people of DuPage Township elect Democratic candidates to elective office.

Article III: Membership

Membership in the DuPage Township Democratic Organization shall be open to all registered voters residing in DuPage Township of Will County, Illinois who have voted a Democratic ballot in the last Illinois primary election. The membership of this organization shall be divided into three (3) categories: Elected Committeemen, Appointed Committeemen and Volunteer members.

Section 1: Elected Committeemen shall be comprised of those individuals who have been duly elected to represent a DuPage Township precinct. Their term of membership shall last until the next election for their office. Elected committeemen are eligible to vote on all matters including election of officers.

Section 2: Appointed Committeemen shall be comprised of those individuals whose names are submitted by the township Chair, to the county Chair for appointment as an appointed committeeman. Their membership term shall last until the next primary election. Appointed committeemen who live in the precinct to which they are appointed must stand for election in the subsequent election. Those appointed committeemen who do not live in their precinct must be reappointed. Appointed committeemen are eligible to vote on all matters except election of officers.

Section 3: Volunteer members shall be comprised of those individuals who want to be involved in the DuPage Township Democratic Organization. The Dupage Township Democratic Organization welcomes volunteers and all those interested to further the purpose of the organization. Volunteer members shall be eligible to vote on organizational matters excluding the budget or officers. Elected Democratic officials and Democratic election judges living within the boundaries of DuPage Township are automatically considered volunteer members.

Section 4: All disciplinary procedures concerning the members shall be conducted in strict accordance with the recognized parliamentary procedures put forth in Robert's Rules of Order.

Article IV: Officers

The Executive Board of the DuPage Township Democratic Organization shall consist of the following leadership positions:

Section 1: The Chair shall be the presiding officer at all meetings of the DuPage Township Democratic Organization. As the duly elected head of this organization, he or she is empowered to form committees, appoint committee chairs and delegate authority to said committees and the committee chairs. In order to preserve the impartiality of the chair, the Chair shall not vote on motions made before the organization, but in cases where the vote is tied, the Chair is empowered to cast the final, tie-breaking vote.

Section 2: The Vice-Chair shall, in the absence of the Chair, preside over all meetings of the DuPage Township Democratic Organization. He or she will also perform any and all other duties the Chair shall see fit to delegate to the Vice Chair.

Section 3: The Recording Secretary shall be responsible for keeping accurate minutes of all meetings of the DuPage Township Democratic Organization as well as any and all meetings of the Executive Board. The Recording Secretary shall also be responsible for distributing copies of prior meeting minutes to the membership before every meeting, making reports and performing any other duties that the Chair may delegate.

Section 4: The Treasurer shall be responsible for all the financial activities of the DuPage Township Democratic Organization. These activities include but are not limited to maintaining the financial records of the organization: the timely filing of all financial reports; receiving and disbursing the funds of the organization with the approval of the Chair; making monthly reports to the membership on the financial status of the organization; and providing accounting, budgeting and financial advice to the organization and the Executive Board. The treasurer shall also perform any duties the chair may delegate. Any proposed expenditure of \$500 or more must be approved by the voting membership.

Section 5: The Chair may if he or she chooses, also nominate up to three (3) Directors to the Executive Board.

Article V: Election of Officers

The election of officers shall be held at the next regular meeting following the Will County Democratic Central Committee Convention. These elections shall be held, except where

otherwise indicated within these by-laws and in accordance with parliamentary procedures as set forth in Robert's Rules of Order. Only elected committeemen may vote for officers.

The first office to be filled will be Chair. The floor will nominate and second all candidates. Once the nominations are closed, elected committeemen will vote by secret ballot. The candidate receiving the majority of votes present shall be declared the winner. If there are more than two (2) candidates running and no candidate receives a greater than 50% of the vote, the top two (2) vote getters shall stand immediately for election and another ballot taken. In the event of a tie, a flip of the coin shall determine the winner. The outgoing Chair will then surrender the gavel to the newly elected Chair who will then preside over the election of the remaining offices.

At this point, the newly elected Chair may, if he or she so desires, offer his or her own slate of candidates for the remaining positions on the Executive Board. If the Chair nominates Directors to the Executive Board, prior to the vote, the Chair must clearly define to the members present the exact roles and duties that the directors would perform as part of the Executive Board.

After the Chair has presented his or her proposed slate, the floor will be opened to the membership for any additional nominations for these offices. Once the nominations are closed, the membership will vote by secret ballot. The candidates receiving the majority of votes present for each office shall be declared the winner as in the election of the chair. In the event of a tie, the process described above shall apply.

Article VI: Removal and Replacement of Officers

Any officer of this organization may be removed from office for conduct unbecoming an officer and or sufficient reason by a two-thirds (2/3) majority of the elected committee members of the DuPage Township Democratic Organization. A vote on removal may only occur thirty (30) days after the membership has been notified regarding any proposed Motion for Removal and said motion must clearly state why such action is being taken. The officer in question will have the right to speak to the body of the DTDO present at the meeting prior to the vote of removal. The officer who is the subject of any Motion for Removal may not preside at the meeting where said removal is debated and decided.

In the event of the resignation or removal of the Chair, the Vice Chair shall temporarily assume the responsibilities of the Chair, pending a new election by the elected committeemen of the organization. This new election must be held within thirty (30) days of the resignation or removal of the former Chair.

In all other cases, the unexpired term of any officer arising by resignation or removal shall be filled by a special election of the members at the second regularly scheduled meeting following the resignation or removal. In the interim, the Executive Board shall be responsible for handling the duties of the vacant office until the new election is held.

Article VII: Meetings

The DuPage Township Democratic Organization will hold its regularly monthly meeting on the second Monday of each month. The Executive Board shall notify all members of the organization at least five (5) days in advance as to the date, time and specific location of any regular meeting. A quorum shall be 2/3 of elected committeemen to vote or remove an officer. All meetings shall be open to the public. A regular meeting of the Dupage Township Democratic Organization may proceed if a minimum of 10% of elected and appointed committeemen are present. The Chair may, with timely notification to the membership, cancel any regular scheduled monthly meeting, but he or she is required to hold a minimum of at least six (6) regular meetings a year.

The Chair may call a special meeting of the DuPage Township Democratic Organization by giving the members at least forty-eight (48) hours notice of the date, time and location of the meeting as well as the reason for its being called. These special meetings will also be open to the public.


All meetings of the DuPage Township Democratic Organization shall be conducted according to the parliamentary procedures set forth in Robert's Rules of Order, except where those procedures conflict with Illinois State Statutes or these By-Laws.

Article VIII: Amendments to the By-Laws

Once adopted, these By-Laws may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) majority of the elected and appointed members of the DuPage Township Democratic Organization, provided that prior notice of the proposed amendment has been read into the minutes of at least two (2) consecutive regular meetings of the organization and all members have been duly notified as to the date, time and location of the meeting where said amendment shall be voted on.


